**Arizona Heritage Center at Papago Park hosts
Phoenix Phabulous History Mural collection and storytelling series**

Public invited to opening reception on Thursday, April 27, 5:30 p.m. to 7 p.m.

Arizona Heritage Center at Papago Park announced year-long art and storytelling installation featuring the Phoenix Phabulous History Mural collection, an indoor mural series sharing the fascinating story of Phoenix in nine distinct time periods.

From the early Hohokam civilization to the imagined future, the display includes 16 large painted murals capturing iconic events representing Phoenix history. The mural collection is on display from now through February 1, 2018 and activated through a four-part storytelling series including hosted networking receptions for patrons and visitors.

The public is invited to an opening reception event at [Arizona Heritage Center at Papago Park](http://ArizonaHeritageCenteratPapagoPark) to be held from 5:30 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Thursday, April 27 featuring “The History of Phoenix in Nine Time Periods: Surviving and Thriving in Phoenix.”

Admission to the reception and program will be hosted free of charge to those who RSVP at azheritagecenter@azhs.gov. The Center is located at 1300 North College Avenue in Tempe.

The opening program will feature keynote speaker Carol Poore, Ph.D., president and founder of the Phoenix Phabulous Mural collection, along with several Phoenix history experts and artists who will bring to life each Phoenix time period in a brief, engaging program beginning at 6 p.m. The reception includes refreshments and the opportunity to mingle with mural artists while viewing the installation.

“The Arizona Heritage Center at Papago Park is excited to welcome both patrons and new visitors to see the Phoenix Phabulous collection as part of the Center’s vast collection of photos and displays telling the story about our Valley’s people and their dreams,” said Tawn Downs, Director at AZ Heritage Center. “The local mural artists engaged with this collection are excited to meet the public during five hosted presentations.”

Local sponsors will help host programs featuring a diverse group of authors, local artists, historians, and Arizona celebrities. Hosted programs and opportunities to meet with presenters and artists will begin at 5:30 p.m. as follows.

- **Thursday, April 27:** Opening reception featuring The History of Phoenix in Nine Time Periods: Surviving and Thriving in Phoenix. (RSVP required at azheritagecenter@azhs.gov.)
- **Thursday, September 21:** The Valley's Thriving Cultures and Communities
- **Wednesday, November 1:** Placemaking Icons: Phoenix City Rising, City Preserved
- **Thursday, January 18, 2018** closing reception featuring Phoenix News Celebrities

The mural project was launched in 2013 by Poore, a native Phoenician and business leader, who selected Phoenix-based artist Hugo Medina as curator. The murals were envisioned and then painted by sixteen local artists, who depicted major time periods and related Phoenix events, landmarks, leaders, issues and urban legends. Since 2014, the murals have traveled to more than 12 Valley public gallery spaces.

“The collection reflects commitment by talented local artists to learn about, and then illustrate the unique and dramatic story of Phoenix,” noted Poore, president and producer of the Phoenix Phabulous Experience. “The murals create opportunities to show the fortitude it took to create a desert community, and our storytellers share fascinating personal stories about their connections to our city and aspirations for its future.”

About the Phoenix Phabulous History Mural Collection

The Phoenix Phabulous History Mural Collection features iconic indoor murals depicting the past, present and imagined future of Phoenix, Arizona's capital city. Launched by businesswoman Carol Poore and created by local artists with help from curator Hugo Medina and Phoenix historians, authors and storytellers, the collection of 16 murals portrays nine distinct Phoenix time periods, each featuring important milestones of community life.

The collection begins with the ancient Hohokam civilization and ends with a vision of the city's future.

One of the many unique pieces include a mural created by artist Darrin Armijo-Wardle, which depicts Phoenix pioneers during territorial and early statehood years. The mural provides a glimpse into the life of the city's founding pioneers, water stewardship, and perseverance to build a community while surviving hot weather and periods of drought and floods.

Other murals feature iconic eras of air conditioning and shift from agriculture to industry after World War II, Phoenix high-rise development and glimpses of the imagined future.

The nine time periods featured in the Phoenix Phabulous History Mural Collection include:

Pre 1867 – Ancient Hohokam civilization, canals and community building (600 A.D. to 1450 A.D.).

1867 to 1880 – Phoenix Wild West pioneering years following the U.S. Civil War.

1881 to 1911 – Pre-statehood emergent years of modern Phoenix.

1912 to 1945 – Statehood and Phoenix expansion.

1946 to 1959 – Post World War II boom Years.

1960 to 1979 – Suburb expansion and growth away from Downtown Phoenix.

1980 to 2000 – Phoenix emerges as a key player to the Southwest Metropolis.

2001 to Today – Major Phoenix revitalization and with particular expansion of biosciences and higher education in the urban core.

Imagined Future – A futuristic look into the vision for Phoenix.

Mural artists include Hugo Medina serving as curator, Amanda Adkins, Anel Arriola, Angel Diaz, Jessica Eddings, Anthony Galto, Damian Jim, Lauren Lee, Jim McCarty, Seth Payson, Michael Pruitt, Lucretia Torva, and Katharine Leigh Simpson.
