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### PHOENIX PHABULOUS HISTORY MURAL TO DEBUT AT ART D'CORE GALA, MARCH 1 PHOENIX MAYOR GREG STANTON TO TOAST DOWNTOWN PHOENIX'S ART AND CULTURE

Phoenix, AZ (February 14, 2014) — On Saturday, March 1, a new collection of iconic indoor murals depicting the past, present and imagined future of Arizona's capital city will make its debut.

The Phoenix Phabulous History Mural will be a featured installation at the Art d'Core Gala, taking place at Crescent Ballroom in downtown Phoenix. The event is hosted by Phoenix Mayor Greg Stanton, Downtown Phoenix Inc. and Artlink Inc, and will spotlight the significant contribution of the arts in invigorating and adding "color" to our urban core. Created by local artists with help from Phoenix historians, authors and storytellers, the initial collection of 12 murals portrays nine distinct Phoenix time periods, each featuring important milestones of community life, beginning with the ancient Hohokam civilization and continuing into the city's future opportunities.

The collection of indoor murals were curated by local artist and Artlink board member Hugo Medina, and produced by Phoenix Phabulous Experience, a local civic engagement organization focused on enhancing urban place making, founded by local business executive Carol Poore.

"Phoenix is becoming known for its murals which help to shape our city's story. Art, and specifically murals, have been recording history and telling stories visually from the first cave painting, and are a vital part of human existence and communication," Medina said. "The

Phoenix Phabulous History Mural is a powerful collection of individual masterpieces that artistically represent Phoenix from many perspectives, together in a unique mural quilt."

The Phoenix Phabulous History Mural will debut March 1 at 6 p.m. at Crescent Ballroom during the Art D'Core Gala. Crescent Crown Ballroom is located at 308 N. 2nd Avenue, Phoenix, AZ 85003. The following weekend, Phoenix History Mural will travel to Walter Studios for a public showing during the 26<sup>th</sup> Annual Art Detour on Saturday and Sunday, March 8 and 9 from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on both days, with scheduled art and history talks planned on the hour and informally throughout the day. Walter Studios is located at 834 N 7th Avenue in Phoenix.

Following Art Detour, from April through end of 2014, the Phoenix Phabulous History Mural will travel to several prominent civic spaces prior to permanent installation soon to be announced. The Phoenix Phabulous History Mural will feature scheduled community dialogues, storytelling, and art talks focused on Phoenix as a unique city with a resilient and vibrant past, present and future.

Artists include Hugo Medina serving as curator, Amanda Adkins, Anel Arriola, Angel Diaz, Jessica Eddings, Anthony Galto, Damian Jim, Lauren Lee, Jim McCarty, Seth Payson, Michael Pruitt, Lucretia Torva, and Katharine Leigh Simpson.

The nine time periods featured in the Phoenix Phabulous History Mural include:

**Pre 1867 –** Ancient Hohokam civilization, canals and community building (600 A.D. to 1450 A.D.).

1867 to 1880 – Phoenix Wild West pioneering years following the U.S. Civil War.

**1881 to 1911 –** Pre-statehood emergent years of modern Phoenix.

**1912 to 1945 –** Statehood and Phoenix expansion.

1946 to 1959 - Post World War II boom Years.

1960 to 1979 – Suburb expansion and growth away from Downtown Phoenix.

1980 to 2000 - Phoenix emerges as a key player to the Southwest Metropolis.

**2001 to Today –** Major Phoenix revitalization and with particular expansion of biosciences and higher education in the urban core.

**Imagined Future –** A futuristic look into the vision for Phoenix.
