Gail Browne, Executive Director of the City of Phoenix Office of Arts and Culture, will provide opening remarks to reveal the city's exciting new vision for arts and culture.



Grady Gammage, Jr. has been practicing law in Phoenix for nearly 35 years. He will share interesting stories about growing up here, and insight about the future of Phoenix development based on his years of work in land use, zoning and real estate projects throughout Arizona.

Grady is a Senior Fellow at ASU's Morrison Institute and teaches at ASU's College of Law, the College of Architecture and Environmental Design, and in the Master of Real Estate Development program.



Mark Stapp is the executive director of ASU's Master of Real Estate Development program and the Fred E. Taylor Professor in Real Estate at the W.P. Carey School of Business. Mark will share his perspective about future development with a focus on sustainability. He is also a faculty associate in ASU's School of Architecture and Landscape Architecture in the Herberger Institute for Design and the Arts.



Victor Vidales—a south central Phoenix native—will share his vision for development Between the 7's: the area between 7th Street and 7th Avenue. The proximity to cultural amenities in Downtown Phoenix and the light rail expansion make this a natural area for development. Victor has been recognized by La Voz and The Arizona Republic among the 100 Most Influential Latinos in Arizona's history, top 250 Latino realtors in the US, and 10 Most Intriguing People in Arizona Business. He is Founder and CEO of RE/MAX New Heights Realty.



Phoenix architect **Ryan Tempest** will discuss his vision for Downtown Phoenix development and the benefits of urban living. Ryan grew up in Michigan and moved to Tempe several years ago to attend ASU.
